Dear friends,

I want to share a personal overview of how things are at HOD from the beginning of our Sabbatical last September, through to April and into the time of Covid restrictions.



Our Prayer life

In times such as these our prayer life is changing. The Lord is calling us to stay awake but even when we are lost, disappointed, suffering or mourning He walks besides us as he did with the disciples on the way to Emmaus. (Luke 24:13-35)

At the beginning of the Pandemic, I felt a bit down because I couldn't go to morning prayers at HOD with everyone; I couldn't go into buildings reserved for residential community; there were no more Friday meetings in the Tithe Barn – all of this making it harder to pray together. And yet the Lord helped us to find new ways to communicate. Along with the rest of the country, we have become very familiar with Zoom.

The Friday speakers have been a blessing, and the Lord has often spoken to us through them about seeking him in prayer, about new vision, about repentance (both individual and corporate), about unity (including with our "older brother" Israel) and about interceding for the nations in this difficult time. On alternate Fridays, we have held prayer vigils, overnight Friday to Saturday, during which we pray in our different homes as well as in the Chapel at HOD, lifting our hearts to the Lord together in the Spirit. 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Hospitality

As you may have seen from the <u>website</u> and <u>Facebook page</u>, in a big change for us, the Retreat House and the Cottage reopened as self-catering facilities at the end of August.

At the beginning of 2020 we had already felt that this was the most practical way forward for running the Retreat Centre. When Covid arrived, we could only praise God for this decision as it made everything so much easier for our facilities to be <u>Covid-safe</u>, whilst still being able to receive guests.

So, over the summer a new kitchen was reinstated in

in the room that was originally the kitchen when Community moved here in 1989! We had previously reinstated the kitchen in the <u>Cottage</u>. We also saw God's hand at work as the end of our Sabbatical overlapped with lockdown which meant there were very few bookings to cancel and deposits to return. God is very good!









It's been encouraging to hear from people that they are just as blessed during their stay as when we served them meals in the dining room. The Lord still speaks to them through our beautiful home...what a precious gift!













Stewardship of what God has given us

Some members of residential community have had to be away much of the time (Lynda and Maria caring for their elderly parents, and Klara in Czech for the same reason.) With fewer hands on site to look after the buildings, gardens, and land, we are asking God to guide practical changes in how we organise our work.

We have a growing band of friends who come to help with practical work, both regularly and from time to time. Our thanks to you ... you know who you are!

By the time you read this we will have had 105 sapling trees delivered to us via the Woodland Trust to be planted out to form a little wild wood. The trees are being cared for at present, to be planted in the new year, and we would be very grateful for volunteers to help prepare the ground and do the planting. We are planting for the future!

These practical changes are only part of a wider seeking God for vision – though an important part. Please pray for God's guidance in these areas, and for His provision at a time which has been difficult for us, as for so many.

New possibilities for mission

In the middle of the restricted situation we find ourselves in, we have been praying for new ways to evangelise, and new possible openings for mission have been presented to us. Some of these are still in the early stages, so please pray that God will bring to birth what He has in mind. Included is a small support group for spiritual directors, art and craft quiet days, and links to a Franciscan led parish in Oxford where we have been invited to go once a month to sing and share the Gospel.

Please pray for these new beginnings, and also that we will find ways to connect with young people.

Seeking the way forward... and Vision for the next chapter

It's a miracle we can't forget that God had already led us into a sabbatical when Covid-19 struck. Our "Pause" to community life has become a bit longer than we expected in 2020! God is helping us to settle into a new routine with many changes, and it is very natural to continue praying, as we did in the Sabbatical, that He will show us what He wants for the next chapter. We also sense that God is speaking new things to many people and communities we know.

What is God saying?

If I were in a room with you, I would ask you: How are you doing? Do you manage to get some fellowship? Is the Lord speaking to you? And I can almost hear some of you asking me: How are you? How is HOD? What is the Lord saying to you? What's the vision?

I feel that the Lord is calling us to go back to the beginning of our community...to be a *House of Prayer for all nations*. Each one of us is a house of prayer, but we cannot be community on our own. What God

spoke to us through Maria's painting in our chapel, of people in all walks of life praising the Lord, has not changed...it has evolved.

I love our prayer vigils. Being quiet in front of Jesus is not a place where I do HIM a favour (i.e. so He doesn't feel lonely!), but has become a



place of safety where I ask the Lord to show me His mercy and teach me his way, and to lead us all. But if I am honest it is a place where I wrestle with Him too! To belong to a community has been a great gift to me all my Christian life. (Even in Italy, before I came to HOD, I belonged to a community there.) And I know that even when I struggle, HOD is a gift to me: it's the spiritual family God has gifted me with. When I am at Childswickham, whether I'm doing a bit of garden work or just sitting in the chapel, I can't help but thank the Lord for the gift of this diverse spiritual family.

So, what is the Lord saying to us? We sense the Lord calling community to be a place of restoration and healing, a place where God "gives the lonely a home", a place for people to meet with the Lord, and a base from which to go out to share His love. This must be why HOD Community is still in Childswickham and is still entrusted with the stewardship of 60 acres of land. The place is significant because it belongs to the Lord!

Our responsibility is to be an expression of His Kingdom, and to affect the atmosphere with our praise and worship.

And yet we are so little now, so few of us! Maybe for some our littleness might look like a sign of weakness, almost a lack of blessing, if we compare the present with earlier days in HOD - but I don't think that at all:

'Who of you is left who saw this house in its former glory? How does it look to you now? Does it not seem to you like nothing?

⁴' But now be strong, Zerubbabel,' declares the Lord. 'Be strong, Joshua son of Jehozadak, the high priest. Be strong, all you people of the land,' declares the Lord, 'and work. For I am with you,' declares the Lord Almighty.

⁵ 'This is what I covenanted with you when you came out of Egypt. And my Spirit remains among you. Do not fear.'

I praise Him for where He has led us to so far. If we at HOD had everything sorted, in a cosy little bubble, we wouldn't have met or needed to meet the amazing people and organisations He has linked us with (I won't name names!), and what a great loss that would have been!

With our churches closed, and being unable to meet together to pray, the use of technology to share our faith and fellowship together, has become not just convenient, but necessary. As a complete technophobe (I have been described as a "dinosaur" by some of my younger friends) this has presented me with a great challenge! Thank God for those who know how and have been able to help people like me!



Our first experiments with Zoom gradually became more established, and as well as using it for business meetings and discussions, we have been able to continue our Friday night meetings too. Each Friday the faces on the screen are a mix of older and more recent friends, and although Zoom meetings can never substitute for being physically present to each other, the meetings are still a great blessing.

European Network of Communities

One of the greatest advantages was being able to attend the annual European Network of Communities (ENC) Conference in November. Usually we send three or four representatives, but this year we all had the opportunity to join the worship and talks from many European countries, online.

As a Community, we joined the ENC two years ago, and we now have a representative on the Council. The Holy Spirit is certainly moving among the Christian Communities across Europe and it is a privilege and blessing to be part of the network, with opportunities

We have in fact been able to "meet" far more people than we would normally, by joining online events, and having others meet us. Our good friends from the Mission organisation Blessed to be a Blessing (BTBAB) have been operating from their base in Murcot, but the new Trainee Director, Esther Price, has moved in to live with us here at HOD, which is certainly a blessing for us. I continued to the final resting place of St. Cuthbert in Durham Cathedral. Walking in the footprints of this saint and other Celtic monks, often on the course of an old Roman road was a little bit like time travel – and arriving at Cuthbert's tomb felt like meeting an old friend.

My time away remained the fuel and inspiration for the rest of the Sabbatical this year....

Prophetic words to community FROM JOHN TRIMMING

Prophetic Words from God are precious – signposts he puts on our way individually and as a group.

Here are some of the words spoken to us over the last three years – mostly by friends visiting as speakers in our Friday Night fellowship meetings held remotely via Zoom:



Your mission is to be like Jesus; you should be "recognised as having been with Jesus" - Acts 4:13. Choose to go through the open door set before you - Rev. 3: 8. (2018)

He congregated here people who are wholeheartedly looking for treasures - for gold; who are willing to dig



deep, who are willing to go through the river of the Spirit -... I will give them that gold and I will also give them oil.... He wants to give you energy to give to other people to keep on going. (2018)

[Picture of rebuilding a stone building]. I have been working in your life. The fire of the Holy Spirit has been burning and refining... You now turn to rebuild and find that the cleansing, cooling rain of the Holy Spirit has washed clean the stones that made up your life. Stones that have been taken through fire. Rebuild with stones of my choosing, those that have been tested in the fire. (2019)

Be anchored to my word... Be set like a sentry on the walls... You may feel you are under an attack which is storming ramparts so that you almost despair. ...In the shattering he has put a sentry who is going to guard your life until Jesus comes. (2019)

"He loved me and gave himself for me" (Gal 2:20). Be faithful in walking with the crucified Christ and offering life to the world with Him. (2020)

Mission

Psalm 95 "Today, if only you would hear his voice, Do not harden your hearts..." – We are all to seek fresh prophecy.


We need daily conversion, knowing we are totally dependent on the love of God: Isaiah 57: 15, "I live in a high and holy place, but I am with the contrite and humble"


Footnote
